Interviewer: Where did you go?

Orson Clark: Florida.

Interviewer: What year did you go to Florida?

Orson Clark: 1971 I think it was.

Ruth Knowlton: What part of Florida were you in?

Orson Clark: We were right at the north end of Lake Okeechobee. That is about the center of the state. We were located right there on the north end. We were there all the time we were there.

Interviewer: How long were you on your mission?

Orson Clark: Six months.

Interviewer: Did you do proselytizing work or were you at work as a Branch President?

Orson Clark: No, it's a funny thing and maybe I shouldn't say this, we were sent out and we went to the office that was there in Florida, the southern part. We drove down and walked in the office there and there were a couple of young Elders there. "Brother Clark, here is this material you'll need and here's a map that will show you where to go. The President will be up to see you." Do you know, we went up there and the president never showed up. What were we to do? We were going on a mission and not a minutes instruction of what they wanted or where they wanted us or anything. The country was new to us.
