IN 1889 160 ACRES OF LAND WERE HOMESTEADED. THEY HAD A BARN A CHICKEN RUN, MILK COWS AND HORSES. THERE WERE TWO ROOMS ON THE HOUSE WITH NO UPSTAIRS AND A SHANTY ON THE BACK OF THE HOUSE FOR A KITCHEN. IT WAS MADE OF LOGS AND LUMBER ON THE INSIDE. THEY TACKED LIGHT TAN FACTORY CLOTH ON THE WALLS. GEORGE L. SMIT(H), AGE 12 TO 17, LIVED WITH HIS UNCLE & AUNT. HE RODE RACE HORSES AND WENT FROM MEMPHIS TN TO NEW ORLEANS LA. THEY HAD SLAVES. WHEN HE LEFT HOME HIS AUNT GAVE HIM #300 CASH. HE JOINED A COMPANY OF GOLD SEEKERS. HE SAID HE CAMPED RIGHT HERE WHERE GEORGETOWN ID IS NOW ON HIS WAY TO CA. WHEN THE CIVIL WAR BROKE OUT (1861) HE AND OTHERS STARTED BACK HOME TO TN TO HELP. SEVERAL THINGS DELAYED THEM AND WHEN THEY GOT TO FARMINGTON UT GEORGE HAD THE MEASLES AND COULDN'T GO ON. HE NEVER MADE ANY CONTACT WITH HIS FAMILY OR FRIENDS AGAIN.(H10)
