LOGAN AND ALICE BORROWED \$400 FROM THE BANK. THEY BOUGHT THREE COWS, ONE TEAM OF HORSES, A KITCHEN STOVE AND A CHEESE TOASTER. WE LIVED ON CHEESE SANDWICHES FOR THREE MONTHS UNTIL ALICE LEARNED HOW TO COOK. FROM ALICE'S HOME A PIANO, BEDROOM SET, RUG, WASHING MACHINE, ETC. WAS MOVED. RENT WAS \$7 A MONTH. WHEN FIRST MARRIED THEY LIVED IN A LITTLE TWO ROOM LOG HOUSE WHICH THEY RENTED(B-3) FROM IDA DUNN(B-4). IN THE WINTERTIME THE SNOW WOULD DRIFT UNDER THE DOOR. THE BEDROOM WAS SO COLD IT WAS BELOW ZERO. ALICE WOULD HAVE LOGAN GET IN BED FIRST AND WARM IT UP AND THEN HE WOULD SLIDE OVER TO THE COLD AREA AND LET ALICE HAVE THE WARM SPOT. THEY FINALLY MOVED THE BED IN BY THE KITCHEN STOVE. THEY WOULD LAY AND REACH OVER AND POKE WOOD IN THE STOVE AND KEEP A FIRE BURNING ALL NIGHT. WE HAD NO WATER IN THE HOUSE AND NO CARE FOR THE FIRST EIGHT MONTHS. THEY WOULD GO OUT ON THE HAY RAKE TOGETHER. ALICE WOULD SIT ON LOGAN'S LAP.(H60)

AFTER BEING MARRIED ONE YEAR THEY MOVED INTO THIS HOME. IT HAD A BATHROOM INSIDE AND SEVEN ACRES OF LAND. IT COST \$3500 DOLLARS. THEY WORKED AT IDAHO FALLS ID FOR THE WINTER. THE TWINS AND JIM WERE BORN WHILE WE WERE LIVING HERE. IN THE FALL OF 1946 THEY SOLD THE HOME TO DON AND ELLEN CLARK(A-6).(H60)

IN THE SUMMER OF 1947 THEY BUILT THE HOUSE AT F-5.(H60)

THEY THEN MOVED TO IDAHO FALL ID.(H60)
