

## INTRODUCTION

THE NEXT DAY RUSSELL HAYES CAME BY AND BROUGHT A FAVOR FROM THE PARTY. HE SAID THAT THERE WERE TABLES SET UP ALL AROUND THE WALL IN THE GYM AND PEOPLE HAD MEMORABILIA AND PICTURES ON THEM. HE SAID THAT THERE WAS A PICTURE OF MY FATHER, ELDRED RUSSELL BACON, ON ONE OF THE TABLES.

I DECIDED THAT THERE MIGHT BE PEOPLE IN THE TOWN, GEORGETOWN ID, THAT HAD PICTURES OF MY PARENTS OR MY GRANDPARENTS OR GREAT GRANDPARENTS THAT I HAD NEVER SEEN.
