He loved America and its Constitution. He had an enviable knowledge of our government, its operations, and the institutions flowing therefrom. Few were ever more interested in our elections and the candidates. He knew the pulse of the electorate on domestic and foreign issues.¹³

He was a good politician and proud of his party.¹⁴
